

### **Meet Dune!!**

Dune came into the Center as a stray in June, 2018. He was 6 months old, skinny, and clearly had not learned much about life as a pet. Since then Dune has had his ups and downs as he tries to learn what is and is not appropriate behavior and that people can be pretty great friends. All of that is very hard to learn growing up in the shelter environment, but he tries really hard and has shown that he is willing to learn.

Dune has a few behavioral issues that interested people should be aware of. He is food aggressive in relation to meal times and his food bowl and he is possessive of toys. Dune has been in a consistent training and exercise program since October, 2018 to help him learn about appropriate boundaries like it isn't okay to jump on people or grab and tug on their shirt sleeves and/or his collar, leash, and harness. He is doing so incredibly well in this program and it is strongly recommended that his adopter continue in a regular training program once Dune is in a home. Because of his known behavioral issues, Dune must go to a kid-free home.

He is a very smart, trainable boy. He has learned sit, down, come, wait, and shake. The sky seems to be the limit in what Dune can learn.

Dune loves all other dogs! He hasn't met one yet that he didn't want to become instant best friends with. He has also been introduced to a few cats without any signs that he'd chase or hurt them (he actually has a cat BFF to play with at the Center).

Dune is still a puppy, just a really big one. Growing up in the shelter environment has limited his life experience and caused some of his behavioral issues. He needs someone who has the experience and the patience to help him continue his journey to becoming the awesome companion we know he can be.

Dune is part of the Friends of Animal Care and Control Second Chance Adoption Program. His adoption fee is \$80. To adopt Dune, start the process by filling out an application. Applications are available at the front desk.
